
## Be ready this wet season



The Top End is affected by severe storms, cyclones and storm surge. **Two to three cyclones may form in our region this wet season.** 




This can turn household items into destructive objects. After the eye of the cyclone passes, the wind blows with equal strength **but in the opposite direction.** 



**If your house is built to code and well maintained, stay at home.** If not, ask friends or seek an emergency cyclone shelter when advised.



Make sure objects like rubbish bins, kids toys and garden furniture are **stowed away or securely tied down.** 



Your cyclone kit needs to sustain you and your family for 72 hours or more. Remember, you need at least **10 litres of bottled water per person, per day.**
